KS1 tests

- KS1 tests must take place in the month of May.

English reading

- 2 papers:
- 1 with text and questions combined.
- 1 more challenging text with the questions in a separate booklet.
- All pupils should be given the opportunity to sit both papers.

- No English writing test – Teacher 's assessment
- Mathematics
- Paper 1 - Arithmetic test Paper 2 - Reasoning



Teacher assessment

For English: reading, writing and mathematics

3 standards:

- working towards the expected standard
- working at the expected standard
- working at greater depth within the expected standard.

For science, one standard (working at the expected standard).

- Each standard contains a number of pupil 'I can statements.'
- Teachers need to judge a pupil shows attainment of all statements within
- a standard and all the statements in the preceding standard(s).
- P-scales are used for pupils with SEND working below these standards.

TEACHER ASSESSMENT

- Teachers make their assessment judgement on a broad range of evidence from across the curriculum for each pupil:
 - their books
 - tests
 - overall knowledge of the child.

English writing

There has been a change in English writing only.

A more flexible approach has been set so that a particular weakness in a child's writing does not prevent an accurate judgement of a child's attainment overall.

Grammar and punctuation are now less prescriptive in the writing.



What are we looking for in writing?

Writing is still based on Teacher Assessment.

ARE:

- Demarcate most sentences in their writing with capital letters and full stops & use question marks correctly
- Use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently
- Spell many common exception words e.g. after, because, could, should, everybody, great.....

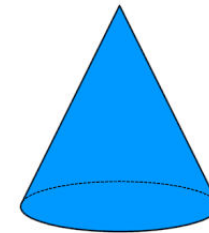
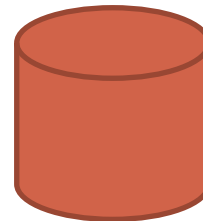


Maths - Reasoning paper
