Year One - Spring Term 2019

Our topic is Toys and Adventures.

Communication, Language and Literacy

This term we will be teaching the children to write stories by reflecting on their own experiences.

We will also be



writing non-chronological reports and learning to recite some poetry.

We will continue to teach phonics for reading and writing. We will also be asking the children to spell common words correctly.

It is very important that you continue to read to your child as well as listening to them read daily.

ICT

We will be using the computers and iPads to create simple animated story and capture and edit an image using a digital device.

Homework

We will continue to be set every half term with children able to select which tasks they wish to complete from the grid. Children do not need to do all activities but at least I per week.

Mathematical Development

We will be helping the children to develop strategies to solve addition.



subtraction and multiplication problems. They will also need to be able to count to and across 100, forwards and backwards from any given number. We will also begin to teach them to count in multiples of 2,5 and 10.

When working with money the children will be taught the value of different denominations of coins and notes. Please help your children develop this skill when you are out shopping.

We will be continuing to teach the children to use: measuring



with rulers accurately.

In geometry they will be taught to recognise and name common 2D



shapes such as;
rectangles squares,
circles and triangles.
To recognise and
name common 3D
shapes including

cuboids, cubes, pyramids and spheres.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

Materials and seasonal changes. The children will compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties. They will use this knowledge to solve problems where they are required to select the best material for a task. The children will also observe the changes across the four seasons, in particular winter and spring, and observe and describe the weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Humanities

The children will be looking at changes within living memory. They will compare and contrast old and new toys. They will describe the characteristics of old toys and suggest who might be able to tell them about toys in the past and ask questions about toys in the past


A visit to the V&A museum of
