At the beginning of the half term we had a Local Authority Review which was very positive.

Here are some quotes from the report:



What did they say?

Teachers continue to work to provide activities which are differentiated effectively and to provide the necessary stretch and challenge to all learners.

Children, including boys, show high levels of engagement and have good behaviours for learning.

Leadership:

The head and leadership team continue to make progress in addressing the recommendations made by Ofsted and are clear about what they need to do to continue to raise standards. Closer moderation, more rigorous planning, focussed lesson observations and the more targeted use of data continue to be evident and contribute to the progress the school is making.

KS1:

In Key Stage 1...there is more evidence of challenge across all abilities, together with planned opportunities for talk. Today's science activities were stimulating and engaging and promoted opportunities for meaningful talk, using appropriate vocabulary. Children were able to demonstrate their prior knowledge and use their reasoning skills in both Year 1 and Year 2.

EYFS:

In Early Years the learning environment continues to be enabling, stimulating and accessible for the children, both indoors and out. A wide breadth of areas are planned for and facilitated through imaginative use of resources as well as play partnering and through adult interactions with children. The activities are adapted regularly and children look forward to seeing what is different and engaging with the new opportunities on offer. Children are confident in their environment and play well together. This is also noticeable for children who have additional needs but share the confidence of their peers in engaging with and talking about their experiences. A variety of creative and engaging activities, including opportunities for mark making, continue to be widely available throughout the environment, both indoors and outdoors. Adults are deployed well, and their engaging approach motivates all children to participate fully.
