Communication and Language

What can you taste?

Encourage our child to describe what they are eating. Does it taste nice? Is it hard or s



Children to retell a simple past event in the correct order (e.g. went downslide, hurt finger) Encourage your children to retell events. Give them time to think about what they want to tell you.

Help to do small jobs around the house

<u>Daily name writing</u> Encourage your child to write their name.

Help them to form the letters correctly.

Nursery children do not need to lead in when writing their letters

<u>Encourage your children to label any pictures they draw</u> most of your children will need support doing this. You can support them by firstly asking them what they have drawn. Then modelling writing the word. (*keep it simple, starting with single short words*) When writing the word say each sound of the letter you write as you write it. Encourage your child to hear the initial sound and tell you what they hear.

Support your child to write numbers 1-10 in the correct order https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BHQ2MbcSRB8
Start with 1-5 and when your child is secure with that, they can then try 1-10

Maths

Numbered paper plates

Write numbers on paper plates – 1-10.

Ask your child, what number is this? (point to a plate with a number on)

They will tell you the number

Ask your child, can you go and get 3 objects and put them on the plate?

Repeat with all the plates

This is a fun way of matching the correct amount of objects to the digit.

Teaching children to count involves more than helping them learn the numbers one to ten. It involves helping children understand the meaning of numbers. This helps children begin to move towards matching one thing at a time with the number as they say it.
