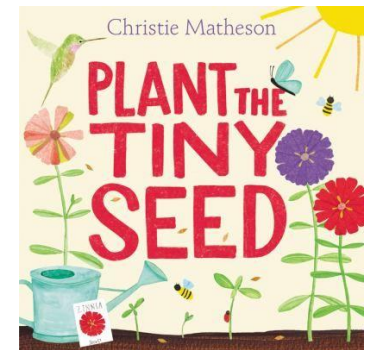

**NUMBERS Counting Subtraction Using objects, subtract two single-digit numbers counting back to find the answer**

Write a simple subtraction problem eg  $3 - 1 =$

Ask your child to count out 3 objects (this could be 3 pencils, 3 beads etc)

Ask your child, how many do you need to take away/ subtract?

	<p>They should take 1 away Then ask them to count how many is left and write that number after the equals symbol</p> <p>Repeat with different numbers</p>
<p><b>Understanding the World</b></p>	<p><b><u>My Bean Diary: Observe – talk about what can you see? Write a sentence about what you can see</u></b></p> <p>Look closely at your bean – you can use the magnifying glass you made last week</p> <p>What can you see? Write a sentence – think it, say it, write it, read it (parents and carers, wait until later in the week when you notice a change in the bean!)</p>
