



Nursery Core Tasks Weekly Overview wb: 15.06.20

Communication and Language

What can you feel? Feely bag activity (*In order to secure childrens learning it is important to revisit activities to imbed their knowledge*)

Children can discover different textures of fruit using their sense of touch. This is a fun sensory idea that will keep the children guessing and is easy to put together.

You can use a cloth bag with a variety of fruit inside. Ask your child to place their hand in the bag, choose a fruit and feel it (without looking).

Encourage our child to describe what they can feel.

How does it feel?

Does it feel hard?

Does it feel smooth?

Does it feel rough?



Physical Development

Fine motor: ice cream sprinkle letter writing

Sensory play at its best! Sprinkles are great for sensory exploration and provide endless opportunities for children to play and discover. You will need a tray and ice cream sprinkles.

Can you write your name in the sprinkles? Which letters can you write in the sprinkles?

Support your child to mark make initially and then encourage them to try writing the initial sound of their name.

Gross motor: (*As we have been supporting the NHS's wonderful work*) Make a rainbow!

On a large piece of paper draw out the arches for your rainbow. Use a variety of resources to colour the different sections. You could use felt pens, pencils, paint, sweet wrappers and anything else you can find around the house.



Personal, Social and Emotional


Children can usually tolerate delay when needs are not immediately met, and understands wishes may not always be met

All children have different temperaments, and some children are naturally more patient than others.

Most children, however, do not enjoy long waits in line at the supermarket, slow dinners at fancy restaurants, or sitting in traffic.

The most effective way to determine how best to teach your child the art of patience is to observe them and try to pinpoint their triggers.

Pinpointing the specific triggers will help you know where to begin. For example, if puzzles frustrate your child because he can't get started, you can help him learn to group the corner pieces, outside pieces, match colours, etc.

Help them to form the letters correctly. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=x1nnOO2OFVI</p> <p>Nursery children do not need to lead in when writing their letters</p> <p>Encourage your children to label any pictures they draw most of your children will need support doing this. You can support them by firstly asking them what they have drawn. Then modelling writing the word. <i>(keep it simple, starting with single short words)</i> When writing the word say each sound of the letter you write as you write it. Encourage your child to hear the initial sound and tell you what they hear.</p>	 
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Days of the week You can use paper plates attached together to make your caterpillar, 7 plates for 7 days of the week. Draw the fruit for each day and stick on. <p>Understanding the World</p>	<p>Make your own fruit salad <i>Which fruit do you like?</i> <i>Which fruit will you use?</i></p> <p>Allow the children to take an active part in making your fruit salad as much as you can. From choosing which fruit to use, chopping the fruit, and tasting. Involving children in meal-time decisions can help give them develop decision making.</p>
