AUTUMN WALK

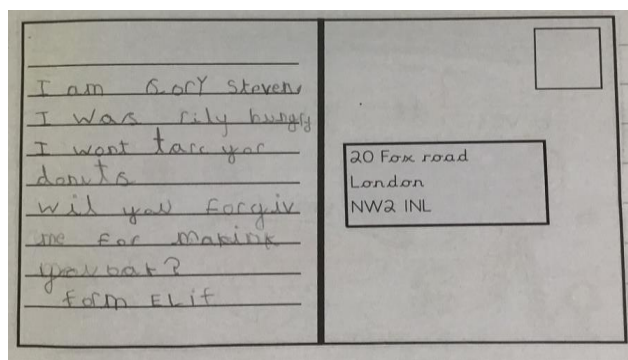


The reception children enjoyed their autumn walk last week. They looked for signs of autumn and made some fantastic leaf people.



Last week year 1 wrote postcards to Steven from the story 'The Shopping Basket.'

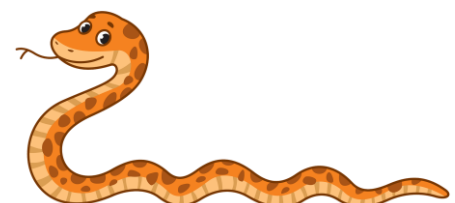
They then posted their postcards and were happy to receive a response from him this week.

Fun Spanish AFTER SCHOOL Club at Tottenham Infant from January 2024

The children have the opportunity to join LCF – our fun Spanish and French after school clubs starting next term.

LCF offer a fun and active language-learning programme specifically designed to introduce early language opportunity to children.

The emphasis is on learning to understand and speak the language, with a good accent, all whilst having fun; and development of social skills.

We learn songs, play games & build our Spanish vocabulary.

- 11 sessions in the Spring term starting with a TASTER session w/c 9th January:
- After school clubs at 3.15 – 4.15pm (day TBC)
- Cost is £ 7.0 per child / week plus a membership fee of £15 (giving access to the interactive club website Babelzone where you can reinforce the learning with games and activities at home).
