












Ricky Resilience






Year 1 Litter Survey

Ducklings

Reception have been learning about people who help us. This week we had a special visit from London Fire Brigade. The talked about their job and showed children how to use the water hose.









It has come to our attention that some of our children are playing games that are unsuitable for their age.

Minecraft has a PEGI age rating of 7+ and Fortnite has a PEGI rating of 12 years old. These games are not suitable for children under these ages and they should not be playing them.

Minecraft gives users the option to play in single or multiplayer mode. When playing multiplayer mode, players can communicate with one another via a chat box. This could put your child at risk of being exposed to inappropriate language or content. You can also send private messages known as 'Whispers'. This feature could put your child at risk of receiving unwanted contact.

As well as the violent aspect of Fortnite, the game has in game audio chat so that players can talk and interact with each other as they play. This means players may be exposed to swearing and offensive language from strangers in voice or on-screen text chats.

Parents are telling us access is sometimes with siblings or when visiting family members. Please note your child's safety is YOUR responsibility. Failure to keep your child safe online could result in a referral to Social Services.


